## GPA

GPA stands for "Grade Point Average." It is a numerical average of your report card grades. By knowing a student's grade point average, you know how high the student's grades are. Having a high GPA is extremely important for college acceptance. PE is not counted by colleges when determining a student's GPA.

Grade point average is determined by adding the number of grade points a student earns together and dividing by the number of grades.

Grades are worth the following number of grade points:
